a note from the Chairman ...

Here we are again, with the Autumn edition of our Newsletter.

A lot has happened since the last edition and one thing has not - our Village Bash. However, the Committee has been working hard to re-organise it and it is now scheduled for **Sunday 19 September** on the Recreation Ground. Please come along and give your support.

The Parish Council also re-scheduled the Annual Parish Meeting, and this was very well attended. We would like to extend out thanks to all the Presenters and to the Church for supplying the refreshments and to those who attended and had questions for the Presenters. The two main topics of concern were the planning application for the Radar Tower to be built on the Tactical Medical Wing site off Carterton Road, and Policing.

From this, we finally secured a Public Consultation Meeting with the RAF and Aquila, the company that will be installing the tower, which was held in the Elder Bank Hall on Thursday 26 August. Unfortunately, this has come too late to report on in this Newsletter, but we will share the details via our website and other social media platforms.

The second topic was around policing as recently there have been reports made to the Police about problems of anti-social behaviour and drugs. We are a small community and we do not want this sort of behaviour to increase. This is where we can all do 'our bit'. There is the opportunity for two initiatives to help with these, but they will not succeed if there are no volunteers and no support. Please don't read this and think "great - I'll leave this to my neighbours" Get Involved!

The first is a Neighbourhood Watch Scheme. Someone has already come forward to look at this and it is hoped that by the next Newsletter he will have something to share with us all. In the meantime, if anyone is interested in joining this initiative then please get in touch with me and I can pass on your details.



The second is Neighbourhood Resilience Group. I will be meeting

with our Community Police Officers to find out more about this and, again, if there is anyone interested in this initiative, then please get in touch with me

The Parish Council was contacted by The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Beacons asking if we would like to be involved in lighting a beacon on 2 June 2022 in celebration of her Maiestv's 70-year reign. Tony Shillingford has kindly volunteered to lead this and there will be further news about this in a later Newsletter. The Nation will come together for a four-day Bank Holiday weekend and there will be a programme of public events planned and communities are being encouraged to organise their own events as well. There will be more on this in the next Newsletter

As well as all of this going on, the Council is also going through some changes. Ben Campion has resigned as Councillor and Alison Riseley has resigned as Clerk. We wish them both the very best of luck for the future and thank them both for their contributions during their time on the Council. We have welcomed David Golding onto the Council. David has lived in Brize Norton for nine years and we are sure he will be a valuable asset to us.

We still have a vacancy for a Councillor so if you are interested in local issues and would like to serve your community then please apply.

We are now back holding our monthly meetings on the first Monday of every month in the Pavilion and anyone is welcome to attend if they just want to come along and find out what is happening in the village or has anything they wish to bring to the Council's attention.

I'd like to finish by wishing you a great summer.

Hedges and weeds

Just a gentle reminder that pedestrians should have full access to a footpath to safely walk along and not be hindered by hedging or trees growing from residents' properties too far over the path. Also weeds that grow around boundary walls or fences adjoining a footpath are the homeowners' responsibility to remove. There are no authorities who undertake this work, so it is up to all of us to keep the footpaths tidy.


Speaking of keen gardeners although all our allotments in the village are occupied at the moment, this can change very quickly so please get your name on the waiting list if you are interested in having one in the future.

Naming of Brize Meadow Country Park

At our Annual Parish Meeting, the Parish Council put forward a motion to name the new Country Park after Mary Ellis who lived in our village from 1928 to 1949.



This motion was unanimously agreed with by the members of our community that attended the meeting.



The 'public green spaces' on Brize Meadow will now be known as Mary Ellis Country Park.

It was whilst researching the name Albert Wilkins, whose name appears on our War Memorial and has Wilkins Close named after him in Brize Meadow, that we discovered that his eldest brother, Charles, lived in The Manor House. Along with his sons, who were Mary's brothers, they farmed the very fields on which Brize Meadow is being built.

Mary learnt to fly at Witney Aerodrome aged just 16. By 1939, at the age of 22, she had gained her coveted pilots' licence - a rare achievement for a young woman at that time.



Her life and exploits during World War II are well documented and are recalled in the book 'A Spitfire Girl'. Mary's actionpacked career spanned almost a century of aviation. From Tiger Moths to Hurricanes and Spitfires, from Wellington


Bombers to post war jets, Mary's desire to take to the skies, even in her centenary year, never faltered.

Mary Ellis (nee Wilkins) passed away on the 24th July 2018 aged 101.



The closing date for submissions is Friday, 25 September 2021 at 6.00pm. (Being no less than 14 days from this notice and shortly before the first scheduled meeting at which the Council could consider applicants on Monday, 5 October 2021).

The eligibility criteria are as follows:

You must:

1. Be over 18 years of age

2. Be a British citizen or a citizen of the Republic of Ireland.

3. Be on the parish electoral roll on the day of co-option and thereafter, or

4. Have occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the parish during the whole of the 12 months preceding the day of co-option, or

5. Have had your principal or only place of work in the area during the whole of the 12 months preceding the day of co-option, or

6. Have resided in the parish, or within 3 miles of it, for the whole of the 12 months prior to co-option

7. Have not held any paid office or employment under this authority

8. Have not been a person adjudged bankrupt

9. Have not been a person who, within five years before the day of co-option, has been convicted of any offence and has had passed on him/her a sentence of imprisonment for a period of not less than 3 months (whether suspended or not) without option of a fine

For information:

- There are 12 Parish Council meetings each year, held on the first Monday of each month, unless it's a Bank Holiday in which ٠ case it is the next Monday.
- Councillors must abide by a code of conduct and complete and sign certain documentation which becomes a public record. •
- It is expected that all Councillors attempt to attend all meetings wherever possible.
- The meetings usually start at 7.30 pm and generally last two to three hours.
- Members of the public can attend the meetings to contribute, raise issues and listen to proceedings.
