Hi, my name is Jo Webb and I have volunteered to be your parent council representative. I represent the year 4s so the year group your child is in.

The parent council is a newly formed group of 7 volunteers, who aim to represent your views and opinions as a parent of the school.

The Aims of the Parent Council:

- Represent the view of all parents
- Report back to parents on matters discussed
- Support the school in its work with pupils and on matters of school improvement
- To give parents a voice and increased their active involvement in decision making
- To develop a partnership to support and promote pupil learning
- Encourage links with school, parents, pupils and wider community

As such the parent council will have an Advisory role - advising the head/governors on matters of importance to the parent body. And a Consultative role - a system for consulting parents on matters of school improvement and change.

We will work collectively as a group, taking your comments and ideas to meetings (we will endeavour to meet monthly) and providing feedback via your year group rep. Any action in terms of change will be decided upon by the school (head and governors) based on a thorough exploration of the pros and cons of such change, through the parent council meetings.
