In 2013, the Government set up £450 million fund to improve physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools over the next 3 academic years

Schools are accountable for how they spend the funding and, as such, must report how it has been used both to improve the quality of PE provision and to increase participation in sport. In 2013-14, Brize Norton Primary School was allocated a grant of £8,465.
