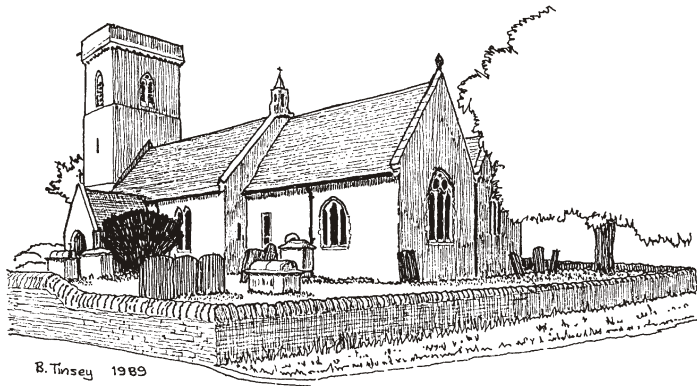


FRIENDS OF ST BRITIUS

Friends of St Britius

To be a "Friend of St Britius" you don't have to be a member of the Church of England, you simply value St Britius Church and its role in the life of Brize Norton.

If St Britius Church is to continue to function and play an important role in Brize Norton then we need to worry about a number of things, amongst which are:

- Having a roof over our heads
- Ensuring the safety and future use of the bells
- Providing accommodation in the vestry for the Sunday Club
- Attracting more visitors to the Church
- A better heating system
- Looking after the churchyard

We have been patching up the roof of the church, but now we need to do major work. Being a Grade 2* listed building a new roof will require Cotswold Slates and will cost £113,000.

With care we can ring the bells in church for special occasions. The bell cage will need replacing in the long term or if we want to use the bells more frequently or invite novices or visitors to ring the bells.

We are welcoming many more to the church with an increased number of weddings and in other ways. The Laying up of the RAF 99 Squadron Standard and the new side chapel cements our link with RAF Brize Norton. We want to open our church to all those associated with the RAF Base now and in the past. In doing so we will need volunteers to look after the church when it is open to visitors.

We have completed our first project - bringing in water and providing a toilet and kitchen. In the meantime the roof has deteriorated further so this must be our next priority.

So with the Friends of St Britius we can not only communicate with but also involve a wider group of people who see and value the church building and keep them informed about the Church.
